<u>RIVER CROSSINGS</u>: How to estimate the risk of a river crossing. If the velocity x depth = more than 10ft./sec. - DON'T CROSS! If it = less than 10 you can most likely get across. Gauge velocity in ft./sec. by measuring a distance on the bank, then throwing a couple of sticks into the river and timing them to cover that distance. For example: if the velocity of the current works out at 3ft/sec/ and the depth of the river is 3 feet,  $3 \times 3 = 9$  and you should be able to get across. On the other hand, if the velocity is 4ft/sec. and the depth is 3 feet,  $4 \times 3 = 12$ , and in this case don't cross.
