#### PAST TRIPS.

##### 20<sup>th</sup> June COPPERMINE HUT.

Coppermine Hut was reached after half an hour. From here Ian took the Wharite party up the track on the spur opposite. Shortly before Heather and I left the hut with our two young but keen trampers (Maire, 9 and Ross 5½) twenty members of the Manawatu Canoe Club, lead by Peter Sutcliffe, thundered by in search of the mines further up a side stream. Some time later we caught up with them just past the first mine which we had inspected. Early in the afternoon we returned to the hut while the Canoe Club carried on down stream. Ian's party arrived soon after and we all had a boil up. The weather began to clear now, having been overcast all day. The cars were reached just before nightfall.

Wharite party: After a short scramble up onto the ridge opposite the hut, a few eager types decided to move ahead of the rest, only to find themselves following the wrong track. Two hours after leaving the hut lunch was had in mist on top of the Main Ruahine Range. Because of the overgrown track and the mist we retreated back the way we came, observing a good view of the Wairarapa through a gap in the clouds.

After a brew up in the hut with the others we made a very hurried visit to the mine shaft and waterfall.

##### 31<sup>st</sup> July-1<sup>st</sup> Aug. SNOWCRAFT II, EGMONT.

On the weekend of 30<sup>th</sup> July-1st August eleven persons enjoyed fine weather and good ice conditions for a course of advanced snowcraft instruction. Friday night was spent in Robson Lodge at the Dawson Falls road end. In the morning we tramped up to the Egmont Alpine Club's 'Kapuni Lodge which was our accomodation for Saturday night. After a second breakfast the party broke up into small groups for instruction on the slopes of Fanthams peak. The light mist and occasional icy squall did not cause any difficulties. Most of the party reached Syme hut on Fanthams Peak. A three course meal prepared by Master Cheffess Heather capped the day.

Sunday dawned fine, calm and clear. We left the Lodge late, about eight, and headed up the slopes towards the summit, crampons biting the ice. The first to reach the summit did so about 10.30 a.m. and the last were in time lunch.

Two boys, about fourteen years old, from the Egmont Alpine Club were ahead of us going up having spent the night in Syme Hut. When we reached the crater they were about to ascend the Crater face of Shark Tooth. This is about 150 feet high above the Crater floor with the last 70 feet nearly vertical ice.
