PAST TRIPS:

The Tasman Wilderness – 18 - 25 December

The Tasman Wilderness is in the North West Nelson State Forest Park just north of the Karamea River. Our plan was to enter the Cobb Valley and traverse the Domett Range to Lake Aorere.

Our first obstacle was a mud slide blocking the road to the Cobb Reservoir. Kevin's excuse was that he had to drive the car! That surmounted, we made our way up and into the Cobb Valley, which was still showing signs of recent wet weather, e.g. lakeside barbeque and picnic tables in 50 cm. of water.

After the usual pre-trip mug shots, we set off up the 'Cobb Valley swamp'. Our equipment was pretty standard except for a fully automated pop-up toaster, (Sorry, camera). Our individual choices of footwear were made on the premise that the whole party had to be able to cope with all possibilities, i.e. Tramping boots for the valleys and easy tops, friction/gum boots for the rock routes and rigid leather climbing boots for any snow and ice.

At the head of the Cobb Valley, the Lalatial Fenella Hut had been transformed into the local commune, so we moved on and put up our first camp on the slopes of Mt Gibbs.

After a quick delicious breakfast of pre-soaked toasted museli (recipe supplied free with a stamped S.A. envelope), we had an entertaining hour or so of cooking macaroni.

We slowly traversed Aorere Peak, taking in some great views of the Anatoki Range and Island Lake. T'was not long after this that we realized that our speedy flight over the Domett Range might take a little longer than anticipated.

My memories of the next few days are still vivid – images of John and Kevin disappearing over the tops of vertical bluffs leaving no clue as to how I was supposed to follow – acute vertigo attacks as we tried to descend the other side! After two days it was safe to bring the camera back, out of the pack. Mt Domett was finally getting bigger as we plunged through the Spaniards down to Aorere Saddle and onto the shores of Lake Aorere.

A campsite was found near the lake outlet, complete with resident kleptomaniac Kea.

Our return route was down the Roaring Lion River and up to an unnamed peak south of Mt Gibbs. After a very brief exhibition of alpine swimming we sauntered back down to Fenella Hut.

John and Kevin fell for my story about a sore tendon and I was allowed to take a short cut back down the valley. The leaders carried on to the Lockett Range and I returned to base camp to lick my wounds. The following day was declared a rest day and time swept past as we searched for Trilobites and tried to identify the local flora and fauna.
