TRIP REPORTS:

July 6 - 7 Introduction to Snowcraft

At some crazy hour of Saturday morning 14 people met at Supersave, then headed for the sun & snow of Ruapehu. By 9.30 after meeting 4 more people and going as far as we could by car along the Tukino road, we set off on foot along the round the mountain track for Rangipo Hut. Once there what began as a snack turned into lunch and then ice axes in hand we headed off up the mountain to find some suitable snow. In groups of 2 or 3 under the eye of our 'instructors' we were explained how to hold and use an ice axe) walk in the snow and then when we found a suitably steep rock free slope (out of the wind) we learnt how to self arrest our simulated falls - in a variety of angles!!! We were also told how to, and then practised, step cutting and then climbed up onto the ridge overlooking the Whangaehu Stream and the N.Z.A.C. Hut precariously positioned above. After wandering back to the hut, the usual cooking and eating of tea followed and most of us were dead to the world fairly soon after!!

Next morning dawned bright and clear and when everyone got organised we carried on round the mountain track to the Wahianoa Stream, and then continued up stream as far as we could. The clear day meant we had superb views of the mountain and its peaks. Our journey upstream was eventually stopped by a waterfall in a cave-like spot surrounded by high cliffs covered in ice formations – a really beautiful spot which had cameras clicking. We then headed back downstream part way and climbed up from the valley to the ridge above. The wind which had come up meant we didn't hang around for long and we went on back to the hut to collect our gear and then began the walk back to the cars. We left the mountain just as the weather began to pack in and headed back to a typical Palmerston winters day. Our thanks to Trevor for all his work in organising the weekend and also to the 2 Daves' , John, Roger and Trevor for their instruction.

July 21 A Gorgeous Day Trip
