12-14th February - PNTMC's Coming of Age Weekend Celebration

There was ample room for tents and access to the local swimming pool and tennis courts. Ngaire and Alan Hancocks' gardens and museum (Ruapuna) nearby added further local interest.

The weekend ran very smoothly with activities for everyone. 32 people tramped up to Rangī Hut by the direct route and the Club's youngest members, Kai (6) and Tai (4) Crow made it to the swing bridge. 22 people followed Trevor up Deadman's Track and down from the tops to Rangī and a further 6 scrambled and clambered their way up the creek to the hut.
